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
## Globalization Program Curriculum

- Candidates may submit proposals for either core courses or specialization track courses.
- A minimum of three proposals must be submitted. Each course proposal must identify for which core course title, or specialization track it is intended. The Academic Council will select two of the three proposals.
- Candidates cannot submit two proposals for the same core course.
- Joint submission of proposals by two or more professors from a member university are admissible.
- One candidate (or candidates if team teaching) per university will be approved per semester.
- Verify in this call (tables p. 4-6) if courses offered by your university have already been approved for a given semester.
- Review Appendix 3 for list of courses that have already been approved by the Academic Council.
- Candidates are encouraged to engage with their representative on the Academic Council before drafting a proposal.

- A maximum of two courses per member institution will be approved per semester.

Professors must be available for the full semester, including orientation and exam weeks. Each course has two classes per week – on a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday schedule. Up to 4 courses in the program may be arranged with an intensive schedule with one 3-hour class per week. This option is available on Tuesday or Thursday afternoons only and is reserved for professors with other teaching commitments in their home university. Requests for this arrangement must be included in the cover letter of the application.

## Submitting Proposals

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Course proposals, a *curriculum vitae* and a cover letter should be submitted via email to the candidate's university representative on the VIU Academic Council (see page 4)<sup>2</sup> and in cc. to the Dean of VIU, Prof. Carmelo Marabello [dean@univiu.org](mailto:dean@univiu.org):

Each course proposal should include the following:



a)	A course description of approximately 500 words
b)	Learning outcomes of the course
c)	Bibliography - all reading materials should be in English
d)	Indication of preferred semester(s)
e)	Identification of which core course or specialization track
f)	Teaching and evaluation methods, including the percentage of the overall grade assigned to each evaluation
g)	Required preliminary knowledge (if any)

The *Curriculum Vitae* should consist of a maximum of three pages, with up to four pages of publications attached separately.

In the cover letter candidates should also include information on their commitments, if any, at the home University during the semester of application.

All course proposals and materials must be in English and in electronic format.

**Deadline: March 15, 2026**

The VIU Academic Council will meet in April 2026 to discuss the proposals. Selected professors will be notified by their university representatives shortly thereafter.

A full syllabus for the approved course, including a weekly breakdown of classes and readings, must be submitted at least six months prior to the beginning of the semester of teaching.

**Remuneration of Professors representing any of the following member institutions, who will teach one course:**

**(Ca' Foscari University of Venice, Iuav University of Venice, IUSS Scuola Universitaria Superiore Pavia\*, University of Milano-Bicocca\*, University of Padua, Tor Vergata University of Rome or CNR-National Research Council of Italy\*, INAF-National Institute of Astrophysics\*).**

Professors teaching one 40-hour course in the Globalization Program of Venice International University will be paid €3,000 (three thousand euro) gross. The necessary tax deductions will be applied at source.

In the event that the teaching load is shared among two or more professors, the sum will be shared proportionally.



\*A reimbursement of travel expenses is also available to those travelling from institutions in Italy outside of the Veneto region.

**Remuneration of Professors representing any of the following member universities, who will teach two courses:**

**(Boston College; Duke University; European University at St. Petersburg; Korea University; KU Leuven, Ludwig Maximilians Universität; Sabancı University; Stellenbosch University, Tel Aviv University; Tsinghua University; Tor Vergata University of Rome; University of Bordeaux; University of Exeter; University of Lausanne; Waseda University):**

Professors teaching two 40-hour courses in the Globalization Program of Venice International University will receive a Travel and Housing Allowance of €8,500 (eight thousand five hundred euro) gross, to contribute to travel, housing and auxiliary costs. According to the guidelines established by the VIU Board of Directors, this sum is gross and all inclusive. The allowance is granted to one Professor from each of the above-mentioned member universities teaching at least two courses (40 hours each) during the Globalization Program. In the event that the teaching load is shared among two or more professors, the sum will be shared proportionally.

According to the Italian tax system the allowance is subject to tax and therefore 30% is deducted at source for personal income tax (IRPEF according to the Italian tax system). The sum paid by VIU to the Italian Tax Authority is deductible from the amount payable on personal income to the professor's National Tax Authority. Alternatively, a Professor may present a certificate of tax residency in a foreign country and therefore receive the gross sum.
